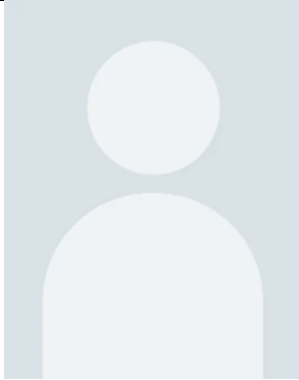
Name: Andrew Mitchell
